### Goggles


Back in issue 6 we mentioned the dangers with poorly fitted goggles and that we prefer children to learn to swim without them. Other than just seeing we use our eyes to help with orientation and estimating distance, should a child fall into water and not be accustomed to opening eyes in water it will reduce their ability to orientate, know where they are, which way up they are and to see where to go. Unless there is a real medical reason or they need prescription goggles we would strongly advise parents to encourage learning to swim without them.

We know you will see most competitive swimmers using goggles, it does help seeing underwater, these swimmers need to see pool markings clearly to perform accurate turns at speed from a greater distance.

### Long distance swim 21st November 2013

We had a very successful swimming session, our pupils who took part averaged 3000 metres, almost 2 miles. At an average age of 10 years it was a marvellous achievement. 3 Swimmers, Jade, Sophie & Danielle achieved distance of 5000 metres. The next long distance swim will be on the 18th December 2014 there will be two shorter distance swims, 3rd July and 23rd October where our pupils can swim up to 1 hour.

### Important—Hair

For safety reasons it is important that pupils with long hair have it tied up or enclosed in a swimming cap. This applies to all pupils where the hair is long enough to reach round to the mouth and / or cover eyes.

### **Showers**

It is important for swimmers to have a shower prior to lesson, there are only 7 showers to share between the 50 pupils we have for each session each having a shower before and after lessons, some pupils are hogging the showers and a few are playing about a bit too much. Our rules indicate it is the parents responsibility for the safety and welfare of their children prior to and after lessons—this includes time spent in the showers. Please ensure your child understands the need to behave in the showers and, as there is limited time per pupil, no playing in the showers.

### **Additional Pool Time**

Our pupils only have 30 minutes a week with us, to help them improve there water skills we advise additional sessions in the pool. Key skills for safety in water are: - Aquatic breathing, balance, buoyancy, co-ordination, movement through water, orientation, rotation, sculling, & treading water. All of these skills can be improved by playing games in water (even blowing bubble in the bath). With these skills strokes come easier.

### Some of our General Rules

- 1 Parents are responsible for safety and welfare of their children prior to and after lessons.
- 2 Do not interrupt teachers during lessons.
- 3 Pupils should shower before lessons.
- 4 Overshoes provided by centre should be used on the poolside.
- 5 Do not obstruct the fire exit or exit routes.
- 6 Distance swims—reasonable strokes required above 100 metres.
- 7 Inform Mr Bright of any changes of information given on enrolment form
- 8 Parents and spectators are to keep to the seated area on the poolside, **DO NOT** cross the area between pools or enter/leave the poolside from the changing rooms
- 9 For emergencies a parent, or someone with parental consent, should be on the poolside during lessons.

### Web Edition

### Our newsletter comes in 3 editions: -
